Re: Concurrent Enrollment of Asian BCLAD Consortium Students

The CSU Asian BCLAD Consortium was formed as a collaborative effort among six CSU campuses to offer BCLAD credential program with emphasis in five Asian languages: Cantonese, Khmer, Korean, Mandarin or Vietnamese. The Consortium members are CSU Dominguez Hills, CSU Fullerton, CSU Long Beach, CSU Los Angeles, CSU Northridge, and Cal Poly Pomona. Different campuses in the Consortium take responsibility to host one or more language emphases. Consortium candidates are allowed to register through Intrasystem Concurrent Enrollment to take specific culture and language courses on that host campus to fulfill requirements. Since some students will complete all course work within an academic year and most Consortium courses are offered at host campuses only once each year, it is crucial to grant permission for them to use concurrent enrollment the first semester they are enrolled at their home campuses and to waive the registration deadline.
